What is an Associate Member?

As an associate member you will be able to apply to join elements of the work we are rolling out through the STAR TSA. Many of these activities are free to members, and other chargeable activities will qualify for a significant discount. Feedback from Associate Member Schools around the work of STAR TSA will always be very welcome, but Associate Members will not be part of the strategic planning and decision making groups and boards.

What can we offer?

Our Associate Membership offers the following benefits as part of the core offer:

- Vitally, membership of STAR TSA – a respected, proactive group of schools, on the leading edge of partnership work in North Yorkshire, taking a solution-focused approach to new initiatives
- A positive, supportive network of colleagues focused on school improvement
- Attendance at locally hosted, cross-phase moderation meetings
- Opportunity to take part in the annual 'Teaching & Learning Community' (TLC) conference which enables teachers to exchange best practice, make links, and plan to improve outcomes for learners
- Significantly reduced rate and prioritised access** to high quality bespoke CPD programmes such as:
 - Support staff development work – we run twilights and training days around generic classroom practise (questioning, feedback, etc) and bespoke interventions such as reading intervention, inference training, pastoral interventions
 - Middle leadership development programme including a residential
 - NQT Programme
 - QT Development opportunities
 - Governor training,
 - leadership training (for example building resilience, tricky conversations)
 - operational training (e.g. 1st Aid, RPI)

Opportunity to participate in research & development projects	Projects are varied depending upon current priorities	Funding for participation can sometimes be provided

Access to moderation meetings for teachers in order to quality-assure assessment judgements with other colleagues	Moderation meetings happen throughout the year in different schools	An annual timetable for moderation is produced in the Autumn term
